Description: This course encourages the development of a believer's obedient relationship with Jesus Christ. Personal devotion, prayer, Scripture memorization, and evangelism are emphasized. Using a small group setting, this course as well as the following consecutive one, Discipleship II, fosters friendship, camaraderie and accountability as students spend 12 weeks learning and growing together toward Christlikeness.

Description: Our core class of our practical curriculum, Essentials deals with your calling as a Christian; your calling as a wife; your influence on children; time management; listening skills; and practical budgeting matters. Essentials II must be taken during the subsequent term, so students make a 12-week commitment when registering for this course. Topics may or may not be taught in the order listed due to scheduling, but all will be covered in either Essentials I or II. You will gain so much from Essentials as you learn from a team of faculty wives who each has a passion for her particular topic.

SW101C WOMEN IN CHURCH HISTORY

Text: Students will choose from a book list posted on Canvas.

Description: This course is an examination of key women throughout Christian history. Both familiar and unfamiliar, young and old, and from a variety of cultures, all of these women are marked by faithfulness to the Lord and influence for Christ. We will be strengthened, encouraged and discipled by their examples as wives, mothers, missionaries and disciples. Students will have reading and short written assignments to be completed in addition to a 3-4 page paper on a biography of their choosing from the provided list given their specific ministry interests.

SW201C LESSONS IN PRAYER

Text: *Praying Together: The Priority and Privilege of Prayer in Our Homes, Communities, and Churches* by Megan Hill, (Crossway) ISBN 1433550512.

Description: Using the prayers in Scripture as our tutor and the character of God as our inspiration, we will discover various components of prayer, the characteristics of praying people and strategies for developing our personal prayer lives. Students will be expected to spend time in the Word and in prayer both on their own and in class.

NEW!!! This class is being offered as a HYBRID class. Students will watch prerecorded videos of the six lectures on Canvas where they will also find handouts and assignments. After they have completed the assignments, they will meet with Mrs. Mohler on Thursday, November 19 in Norton 104 from 7-8PM for an Enrichment Session to discuss the class and ask questions. Access to course content starts on September 25. Students may simultaneously take an on campus SWI class.

SW201E MINISTRY OF HOSPITALITY—HYBRID FORMAT
